



General concept

The logo of the Eurasian Congress on Administrative Law is designed in a restrained and formal style, reflecting the ideas of professional unity, continuity of legal traditions and service to the principles of justice.

1. Textual Element

The textual element of the logo symbolizes a community of specialists in the field of administrative law united by shared academic, professional and law-enforcement practice. The arrangement of the name along an arc emphasizes the unity and integrity of the professional community in the field of administrative law.

2. Central Element — the Column

Positioned at the centre of the composition, the column represents the stability, support and fundamental importance of administrative law as one of the principal branches of public law. The tree-like form of the column symbolizes the organic development of the legal system, its rootedness in legal culture, and its capacity for growth, renewal and continuity.

3. Interwoven Ornament (ropework)

The woven structure of the central element symbolizes the enduring connection between generations of legal professionals, schools of legal thought and legal traditions. The interlacing rope motif conveys the unity and continuity of the professional community, bound together by shared values, experience and a lasting sense of responsibility extending across generations.

4. Laurel Leaves

The leaves positioned on either side of the logo evoke the traditions of classical antiquity, including those of ancient Greece and Rome, which constitute one of the foundations of continental law. They symbolize recognition, dignity, wisdom and justice. The symmetrical arrangement of the leaves also evokes the scales of justice, emphasizing balance, objectivity and the pursuit of a fair resolution of public-law disputes.



Overall Composition

Taken together, the elements of the logo convey the idea of consolidating the administrative-law community across the Eurasian region, grounded in well-established legal traditions, academic continuity and commitment to the ideals of legality and justice.
